



# Two-Tiered Government

Unlike major cities, our region is governed by two levels of government. The upper tier (regional) level is the United Counties of Prescott and Russell, and the second tier is the Township of Russell. Although we have similar names, we are responsible for different services.



### **United Counties of Prescott and Russell**

The United Counties of Prescott and Russell (UCPR) is the upper tier (regional) level of government overseeing eight townships, municipalities, and cities, including the Township of Russell, as shown on the map above.

The responsibilities of the UCPR include:

- · paramedic services
- · maintenance of major roads (county roads)
- social services (social assistance, housing)
- · private home daycare licencing
- Larose Forest

### 2026 Election

There will be a municipal election in October 2026. Do you want voting on election day to be quick and easy? Update your information in advance! Visit Elections Ontario's Voter Registration site www.registertovoteon.ca to confirm, update or add your information for provincial and local elections in Ontario.

### **School Support Selection**

In Ontario, property owners and tenants can choose which school board they support through their property taxes collected by the Township. This designation also helps determine how you're listed on the Preliminary List of Electors, placing you on the correct voters list for the municipal and school board elections. Review it by June

1, 2026, so you're ready to vote on October 26, 2026.

MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) is legislatively responsible for collecting school support designation data. This information is provided to Elections Ontario to help build and maintain the Preliminary List of Electors.

### Garbage, Organic and Recycling Collections

- GARBAGE: is collected weekly. Each household is allowed one bin per collection.
- **ORGANIC:** (also known as compost or green bin) is collected weekly. Each household is allowed one bin per collection. To receive organic (green) and solid waste (black) bins as a new resident, contact us at infrastructure@russell.ca or 613-443-1747.
- **RECYCLING:** is collected weekly. This collection is completed by a third party, for more information contact Miller Waste at www.millerwaste.ca or 1-800-465-5914. New residents can contact them directly to receive a recycling bin.

  - Always put your bins at the curb before 7:00 a.m.

### **Dog Tags**

- Dogs must be registered with a Township dog tag.
- If you are a homeowner, the renewal fee will be added to your interim property tax bill each March.
- If you are a renter or non-homeowner, a reminder will be sent to you each January.
- It is the responsibility of the owner to notify the Township of any changes or that the dog is no longer part of the household.
- Purchase your dog tag online at www.russell.ca/dogs, or in person at Town Hall.
- Dog tags are required at the Dog Park at 550 Notre-Dame Street, Russell.

There are two tax bills per year. An interim tax bill is sent in March and is due in two installments: March and May. 

# By-Laws to Know



### **Animals**

- Dogs must be registered and always wear their Township tags. For more information, visit www.russell.ca/dogs.
- · Households within village limits are allowed two dogs.
- · Households outside village limits are allowed three dogs.
- Pets are not allowed near play structures, Russell Centenial pool, or splash pad.
- Lost dogs or wild animals in distress can be reported to our Public Safety and Enforcement Department.
- Dogs must always be on a leash, except at our off-leash Dog Park.



### **Fences**

- Maximum height of a fence on a side or rear yard is 2.1 metres.
- Maximum height of a fence on a front yard is 0.9 metre.
- A fence cannot be within 1.5 metres of a fire hydrant.
- · Fences cannot be on an easement.
- · A permit is not required for a fence, but must follow the Fence By-law.
- · Call us for more guidelines before starting your project.

### **Parking**

- Where there are no signs, parking is permitted for 3 hours.
- Do not park on the landscaped portion of the road allowance.
- Do not block or park within 1.5 metres of another driveway or 9 metres of an intersection.
- Overnight parking is not allowed in municipal parking lots (except for locations allowed during winter parking bans).
- From November 1 to April 1, street parking restrictions are alert-based.
- An alert will be issued when 5 cm or more of snow or freezing rain is in the forecast and will be sent out by 2:00 p.m. restricting on-street parking from 1:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.

### **Fires**

- · A permit is required for an open-air fire.
- Campfires do not require a permit. Only dry wood can be burned. The campfire must be 4.5 metres away from property lines and not in a front yard.
- Your campfire must be less than 0.5 cubic metres and supervised by an adult.
- Before lighting a fire, visit www.russell.ca/fireban. If a ban is in effect, no fires are allowed, even with a permit. Sign up for fire ban alerts at www.russell.ca/subscribe.

### **Noise**

- General noise regulations are from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. seven days a week.
- Some activities are prohibited at all times, or during specific hours.
- · Fireworks are only allowed on certain days.



### **New York Central Recreational Trail**

The year-round 10 km recreational trail is ideal for hiking, cycling, jogging, rollerblading or walking. eBikes are only permitted on the trail if powered by muscular power. This recreational trail was once the main railway between Ottawa and New York. The Township purchased the trail in 1979 and converted it into this multi-use recreational trail.



### **Recreation Complex**

A new Recreation Complex is in the works! It is set to open in the fall 2026 and will serve as the community hub for recreation and culture for our growing community and surrounding areas. The location of this complex will be between Embrun and Russell on the land adjacent to the Sports Dome. The complex will have an indoor pool, 3 rinks and a community hall. 

### Garbage

- Garbage is collected weekly.
- Each household is allowed one black bin per collection.
- Place your bin at the curb before 7:00 a.m.
- · Do not mix recyclable materials into your garbage.
- When there is a statutory holiday, your collection may be delayed by one day. See the calendar for details.

### Recycling

Recycling is no longer managed by the Township. For details, contact Miller Waste at area2@MillerWaste.ca or 1-888-852-2374.



### **Leaf and Yard Waste**

- · Collection will take place on your usual weekly collection day.
- The curbside leaf and yard waste collection is free.
- Leaf and yard waste must be packaged in paper bags or in reusable containers and placed by the curbside by 7:00 a.m.
- · Plastic bags are not accepted (except biodegradable bags).
- Bundle and tie branches; branches should not be longer than 120 cm (4 feet) and 5 cm (2 inches) in diameter.
- · Halloween pumpkins are accepted.

Don't wait until collection day. Bring your leaf and yard waste to the GFL Transfer Station for free any time of the year at 211 Corduroy Road, Vars.

### **Organics**

- Organic collection, also known as compost or green bin is collected weekly.
- · Each household is allowed one green bin per collection.
- · Place your recycling at the curb before 7:00 a.m.



### Large Item Collection

### 1 item only per residence

- Maximum weight limit of 100 lbs, except fridges and freezers
- Put your item at the curb for 7:00 a.m. on the Monday of the collection week, regardless of your regular collection day.
- Items with refrigerant gas (freon) must be emptied and tagged by a certified technician. Restrictions apply.
- · For a list of items that are accepted, visit www.russell.ca.



### **Christmas Tree Drop-Off Days**

At the end of December and the beginning of January, natural Christmas trees can be dropped off, at no cost, to the designated areas at the Embrun and Russell arenas. Please remove all decorations.



### **Curbside Exchange Days**

Prepare your treasures with a "Free" sign and put them at the curb between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. At the end of the day, bring any uncollected items back to your home.



### **Community Clean-Up Day**

Help us make our community cleaner by cleaning parks and neighborhoods. You can leave the bags at the curb. No tags required.

### Diaper Program

We have 10 grants valued at \$200 each available for washable diaper users.

# Pre-Authorized Payments and e-Billing Registration Form

### Register for Pre-Authorized Payments (PAP)

### **Section 1: Registration Process**

- 1) Read the information and conditions below;
- 2) Choose pre-authorized payment option A or B;
- 3) Join a cheque marked VOID or a direct deposit form;
- 4) Return the signed form and void cheque by email to taxes@russell.ca or in person or by mail to 717 Notre Dame Street, Embrun, ON, K0A 1W1.

### **Section 2: Information and Conditions**

General information and conditions:

- You must advise the Township if your banking information changes, if you are selling your property or if you wish to cancel your plan.
- After two returned withdrawals, we will cancel your preauthorized payment plan.
- · There is no setup fee to open an account.
- At the beginning of each year, for the monthly tax payment registrations, the Township of Russell will send you a letter confirming the amount of your withdrawals for the current year.
- Once your PAP registration is activated you will see a note at the bottom of your invoice "DO NOT PAY PAP".

Information and conditions for option A:

**Section 3: Personal Information** 

- For property tax accounts, the withdrawals will be calculated for January to August as equal monthly billing equivalent to the previous tax year divided by 12 months, and September to December as the current adjusted taxes minus the amount paid to date divided by 4 remaining months.
- For water and sewer accounts, your withdrawal will be adjusted following the quarterly readings, according to your consumption for the January, April, July and October due dates.
